## **Program Curriculum**

#### Goal

Our goal is to develop residents' knowledge and expertise in the core areas of the health humanities. Beyond this, the resident will gain mentorship, support, and experience in specific areas of their choosing, included, but not limited to, the application of the health humanities as a teaching tool across the spectrum of health professions education, the use of humanities-based disciplines in answering research questions, applying the humanities towards advocacy, public health, or writing, or using the humanities in community-building and engagement. A focus on health equity will be a crucial component of any of these approaches.

#### Objectives

By the completion of this FAST, the resident will:

- 1. Have an understanding of fundamental components of the health humanities, including, but not limited to narrative medicine and art museum-based health professions education/visual thinking strategies.
- 2. Understand the application of the health humanities to medical education, scholarship, and advocacy
- 3. Be able to recognize and reflect on social issues in health and healthcare
- 4. Develop skills in exploring the perspectives of patients, caregivers, and healthcare providers on health and disease
- 5. Develop skills in perspective-taking, observation, analysis, and absorption of the story via the practice of narrative medicine and visual thinking strategies

- 6. Develop the foundation for a potential future niche in the health humanities via the mentored completion of a scholarly project, development of an educational activity, or creative work
- 7. Have participated in departmental, institutional, and community-centered educational activities
