Medicare Help (QMB/SLMB), Maryland Senior Prescription Drug Assistance Program (SPDAP) provides financial assistance to moderate-income MD residents who are eligible for Medicare and are enrolled in a prescription drug plan.

• November 1, 2024 - January 15, 2025 Maryland Health Connection

Private health plans and Maryland Medical Assistance for 2025. <u>Click</u> to browse plans and get an estimate of cost. Nine out of 10 people who enroll are eligible for <u>financial help</u>.

All plans available through the <u>Maryland Health</u> <u>Connection</u> cover important health benefits - doctor visits, prescriptions, mental health services, and more. If you qualify for Medicaid you may enroll any time of the year.


