ABOUT THE OFFICE OF ALUMNI RELATIONS

The Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine Office of Alumni Relations is dedicated to fostering a lifelong connection between the school and its distinguished graduates. The office serves as a vital bridge, connecting alumni with students, one another, and with their alma mater. Our mission is to enrich the lives of our alumni by providing opportunities for connection while cultivating a strong sense of community and supporting the institution's mission of excellence.

SUPPORTING OUR STUDENTS

WHITE COATS AND STETHOSCOPES

Alumni sponsored 120 stethoscopes and white coats for first year medical students and 178 lab coats for graduate students. We raised \$24,575 for medical student white coats and stethoscopes and \$2,551 for graduate student lab coats.

ORGANIZATIONAL SUPPORT

The JHMAA provides annual funds to student and trainee organizations at the School of Medicine, including the House Staff Council, the Graduate Student Association, the Johns Hopkins Postdoctoral Association, and the Medical Student Senate. This year, the Office of Alumni Relations also sponsored a Taharka Brothers ice cream truck for the Graduate Student Association and Resident Appreciation Weeks.

STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP

The JHMAA Centennial Endowed Scholarship provides medical students with financial aid. In FY24, the \$5,000 scholarship went to a talented 4th year student. The JHMAA also sponsored Young Investigators Awards for postdocs and fellows.

MATCH DAY AND CONVOCATION

The JHMAA contributed a photo booth for Match Day and distributed graduation gifts to the Class of 2024 including boxed notecards, key chains, graduation videos, and a message welcoming them to the JHMAA

MOCK INTERVIEWS

130 alumni interviewed at least one 4th year student as part of our virtual Residency Mock Interview Program.

UIM/S DIRECTORY

120 alumni have joined our directory of Underrepresented in Medicine/Science (UIM/S) alumni, a resource that connects UIM/S alumni and students across the country. The directory includes alumni from across 114+ cities in the United States.

STUDENT AND ALUMNI CONNECTIONS

This year we hosted:

- 6 In-Person Dine with a Docs
- 6 Virtual Connect the Docs
- 2 In-Person MedTalks

Over 260 students attended these programs throughout the year.

The Office of Alumni Relations also created a new program called Charting Your Course, which provides residents and fellows with important skills for continuing their careers after residency or fellowship.

We tabled at the medical and graduate student orientations and provided candles, welcome cards, and popcorn to students on behalf of the JHMAA.







SUPPORTING OUR ALUMNI



GREETINGS PROGRAM

The Office of Alumni Relations sent 28 greetings/gifts to alumni to celebrate life milestones, including the birth of children, anniversaries, weddings and more.

VIRTUAL CLASS GET-TOGETHERS

The SOM Development and Alumni Relations team hosted virtual class reunion/get-togethers that provided alumni the opportunity to reconnect across the country.

CONFERENCES & REGIONAL PROGRAMS

The SOM Development and Alumni Relations team regularly hosts events at conferences and other regional gatherings that alumni attend. In FY24, we hosted 7 programs, including Breakfast at BIO at the BIO Conference, and an alumni networking event at the American Heart Association's Scientific Sessions in Philadelphia.

DEPARTMENT WEBINARS

We partnered with departments at Johns Hopkins Medicine to host 4 webinars open to all alumni. These included virtual webinars on MRI imaging, practicing gratitude, and artificial intelligence.

COMMUNICATIONS

JOHNS HOPKINS MEDICINE MAGAZINE

The JHMAA continues to support the Johns Hopkins Medicine Magazine each year. The SOM Development and Alumni Relations team also contributes stories, class notes, and obituaries. The magazine is published three times per year and reaches over 32,000 subscribers.



SCHOOL OF MEDICINE ALUMNI & FRIENDS NEWSLETTER

We expanded our reach to 37,170 subscribers with an average open rate of 48.79% (industry average 21.5%). We also added a new section called "This Month in Hopkins History" to celebrate significant moments in the institution's history. The JHMAA, under the guidance of Dr. Giannina Lissa Garces-Ambrossi Muncey (Med '09), began a literary section called *Accumulative Observation* to elevate the voices of our community. Pieces are featured in the newsletter and all alumni are invited to submit a story.

In FY23, we were proud to launch the Paul B. Rothman Student and Trainee Wellness Grant Program to provide up to 10 grants annually for initiatives that improve the health and well-being of students and trainees.

\$500 to support a workshop where MS1s and MS2s will be introduced to the field and given the chance to practice their dexterity.

PERRY INITIATIVE OUTREACH PROGRAM

\$1,500 to support an outreach program to engage local high school women in orthopaedic surgery through a partnership with the Perry Initiative. A daylong program includes speakers and hands-on activities.

\$1,500 to support the annual lecture in honor of Dr. James E. K. Hildreth, Johns Hopkins alumnus and the first Black professor to be promoted to tenure at the School of Medicine. \$1,500 to support a program using telepresence robots at partner attractions that enable hospitalized children to enjoy a remote experience, most recently in partnership with the San Diego Zoo.

\$1,500 to support matching refugee families with medical students in the Refugee Health Partnership where students help family members navigate the health care system.
