

#### **Nourishment for Patients: Support the Infusion Center Campaign**

Sibley's infusion center sees hundreds of patients each week as they receive critical infusion treatments of chemotherapy, immunotherapy, and more. Just last year alone, there were over 22,000 appointments in the infusion center. Patients must come in frequently, and our expert and compassionate nurses do everything they can to make their experience positive despite the difficult circumstances.

Patients who come to the Infusion Center at Sibley receive treatments that can last many hours, sometimes over lunch. Many cancer patients are in financial need, have mobility issues, cannot get to the cafeteria, or did not prepare food at home. To support these patients, Infusion Center nurses often use their breaks and sometimes their own money to buy cafeteria lunches. Through the generous support of our donor community, the Sibley Foundation alleviated this stressor for our patients by providing free, healthy meals and snacks.


#### **SHINE Award Winners**
