### **Research Focus**

My research focuses on ophthalmic epidemiology, ophthalmic surgical outcomes, and corneal infections. I have designed, conducted, and/or analyzed data from two international trials in South India and Tanzania. I conduct surgical outcomes research focusing on cataract, corneal, and anterior segment surgery. I also conduct "big data" analysis of health care claims data from Medicare and private insurance datasets to examine several clinical, epidemiologic, and health policy-related questions in ophthalmology. This research has led to several publications in the peer-reviewed literature and has been cited by mainstream news outlets such as *The New York Times, Time Magazine*, and *U.S. News and World Report*.
